Reading RaptorMed Treatment Sheets

RaptorMed is our digital patient tracker. Each day we print treatment sheets for our birds that will change week to week. Learning to accurately read these sheets and fill them out will be a vital part of your position.

Find on your treatment sheet

Treatments are broken down into how many different times a day they are treated.

SID – Once a Day. These are our **Diurnal** or **Nocturnal** birds.

BID – Twice a Day. These birds are treated twice a day. This is to space out medications or to ensure that birds are being fed multiple times a day.

Can you think of a reason a bird might need to be fed more than once a day?

Find a bird that is BID and a bird that is SID, what is their patient ID number.
